Resident Spotlight Eula Foster

Eula Foster was born October 21st in Wilkesboro, North Carolina. She is the youngest of 13 children.

Growing up during the depression was difficult. Her father, Everette, worked at the saw mill during the day while her mother, Matilda, took care of the farm and the children. They raised chickens, had some farm animals, and grew a garden every year. During the summer months they canned, dried, and stored food for the winter.

Eula met her future husband, Harold Foster, in Wilkesboro. They married after he served in the Army. Together they had four children: three daughters and a son.

Eula and Harold loved to square dance. They wore matching outfits and enjoyed dancing for years. Their favorite vacation place was the beach. In their younger years they would pack a tent in their car and camped close to the water. Meals were cooked on a Coleman cook stove and at night marshmallows were toasted on a camp fire. They played cards by the light of an oil lamp. Their days were spent on the beach under an umbrella.

Not long after they married, they bought some chickens and started selling eggs for a living. Eula helped on the chicken farm for years. During the summer she grew a garden and canned food.

In 1969 they stopped selling eggs and opened a lawn and garden center on 421 North. For 25 years they grew and sold plants. They also sold soil, seeds, mulch, fertilizer, trees, shrubs, cements, Christmas trees, pots and garden tools. Part of the center was a florist. Eula did flower arrangements for weddings and sold cut flowers. At the end of the day she would smell like flowers.

Eula is a member of Mount Pleasant Baptist Church.

Family is very important to Eula. She has four children, nine grandchildren, twelve great-grandchildren, and three great-great-grandchildren. She likes to look at pictures of them and brags about them often.

Eula loves being around others and spending time with family. Her children visit every day. They talk and do rehab exercises together. One of Eula's favorite games is Bingo.
