Resident Spotlight Nellie Davis

Nellie Colene Sain Davis was born October 7, 1924 in the little cotton mill town of Cooleemee, NC. She was the first of four children born to Ernest Everett (E.E.) Sain and Bessie Allen Sain.

She graduated from Cooleemee High School in 1941.

Nellie and her best friend, Ruby, never would have guessed that they both would meet their future husbands at the movie theatre sitting in the row behind them that day, while celebrating Nellie's sixteenth birthday!

Nellie and Preston Davis were married about two years later in the Parsonage at her church on December 22, 1942. When Preston arrived at Nellie's house to pick her up for the wedding ceremony, she was giving her cat a bath!

Preston was in the Army during WWII and was called to serve overseas shortly after they were married.

Nellie packed her bags and moved to Kannapolis, NC and began work at Cannon Mills as a Time Keeper. She boarded at Mary Ella Hall, and remembers paying \$11.00 a week for room and board which included three meals a day.

Nellie was offered a better job at the Carbon Plan in Winston-Salem, NC and worked there for about a year until the plant closed their doors the day the war was over. She then moved back to Cooleemee and waited for her husband's return.

Nellie and her husband moved to Winston-Salem and both started working at Hanes Hosiery on January 2, 1946 on the same day. Preston later took a job with RJ Reynolds Tobacco Company and retired with 30 years of service. Nellie remained at Hanes for the next 29 years until she was offered a better job at Owen's Illinois as a line supervisor. It was then in her mid-50's that Nellie would have to learn to drive. She worked there until she officially retired in 1986.

Nellie and her family moved from Winston-Salem to Midway, NC in 1970 to a house they had watched being built. When the present owners listed the house for sale, Preston made an immediate offer and bought the house along



with five lots next to the house. Her daughter, Tammy, built a house on the extra lots.

Nellie has four beautiful and faithful daughters whom she loves and adores. Brenda, Vivian (who is watching over her from Heaven), twelve years later came Tammy, and four years later her daughter Debbie. Nellie and Preston enjoyed 47 beautiful years together.

Nellie is most proud of her five grandchildren, and her five great-grandchildren.

She has been a member of Wallburg Baptist Church since 1970.

Nellie's hobbies include reading, making doll cakes, and embroidering. Each of her children and grandchildren have embroidered quilt-top quilts. She has made more baby blankets than she can even count.

She is very active and participates in most of the activities offered. I think we have finally made a Bingo player out of her. Winning last month's Jackpot \$ may have had something to do with that. ☺

Nellie and her devoted family have been an inspiration to each of us. Her daughters come for lengthy visits each and every day!
