Resident Spotlight Laura Simmons

Cordelia Laura Maxwell Simmons was born on April 10, 1936 in the town of Columbus, GA. She was the ninth child of 11.

She married Earl Glenn Simmons in September 1952 in Columbus and honeymooned at Jacksonville Beach, FL. Earl was in the army and shortly after they married, he was assigned to duty in Bad Nauheim, Germany. Laura was one of 13 wives who joined their husbands in Germany, as the military did not make travel allowances for families on international assignments. Laura and the other wives had to picket the Base Commander's home in order to be allowed to shop in the base commissary! Earl and Laura have five children whose birth places reflect their Army travel. Oldest son, Glenn, was born in Frankfort, Germany. Laura Lynn and David were born at Fort Stewart, Georgia. Karle was born at Fort Huachuca, Arizona. Denise was born at Fort Wainwright, Alaska. Almost each new place brought a new addition to the family! Laura did three tours in Germany, before returning stateside for good. After Earl retired in 1969, they resided in Jacksonville, FL until they moved to Pfafftown, NC in 2002. Earl passed away in 2003.


Laura was a master seamstress sewing the majority of the family's clothes, wedding dresses, and band uniforms. Their home was full of her home accessories including draperies, pillows, and quilts. In the early years in Jacksonville, she taught kindergarten at their church. She started working at Phelp's Fabrics in Jacksonville and helped design and sew pageant gowns for the Miss Florida and Miss Georgia beauty pageants. She eventually became the manager when they opened a second location in Mandarin. One of her favorite customers was a Dean at Florida Community College of Jacksonville and this led to Laura becoming an instructor in their fabric department. She taught Fabric Art for many years with many of her students taking her courses semester after semester. Laura and her student's did all of the window treatments for the Habitat for Humanity Homes in Jacksonville.



After retiring from the college and moving to NC, Laura started using her sewing talents mainly for quilting and was an original member of the quilt guild "East Bend Happy Quilters." She still remains an honorary member of the guild. She passed her love of quilting on to her daughters and two of her granddaughters. All of her children, seven grandchildren, and most of her 14 great grandchildren all have quilts that she made. One of the things Laura was known for is she never sold a window treatment or quilt, she only gave them away!


