Springtime in Bloom

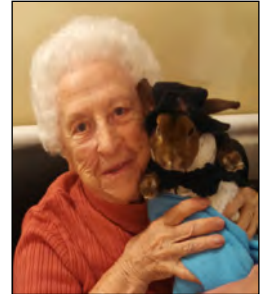

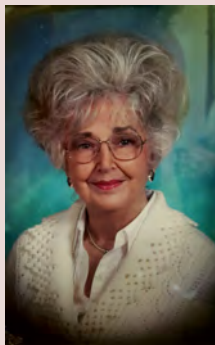

Teach us how to walk with man each day that we may live,

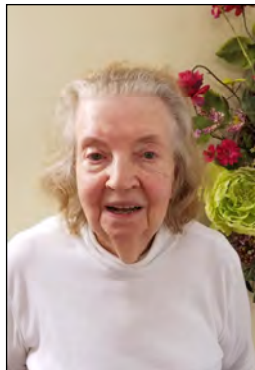
To honor your precepts as in the days of old
