SAUSAGE WEDGES

- 1 pound ground sausage (your choice)
- 1 package English Muffins
- 2 – 5 ounce jars Old English Cheese Spread

Brown sausage in a fry pan –add sage, hot pepper flakes as desired or to taste, Drain grease off sausage & return to pan. Spoon the 2 jars of cheese into the the drained sausage and stir to mix. Split each English Muffing into a top and bottom half. Spread the sausage cheese mix evenly over the 12 muffin halves. Bake at 350 degrees for 12 to 15 minutes. Cut each half into 1/4th s – like a pie slice. Can leave whole and not cut. If cutting into fourths, this makes a great appetizer.
